

DELEGATES

Delegates are elected in the State primary elections every two years. If you ran as a candidate or a delegate in the September primary and won, you are a Delegate.

Delegates have two responsibilities:

1. They are notified by a member of the State Committee, to Caucus before December 15, after the September primary, for the purpose of electing the Members of the State Republican Committee.
2. They meet in Convention in April of the second year after their primary election, to vote on the State Republican platform.

Delegates may, or may not, be elected as Members of the State Committee.

MEMBERS

Members of the State party are Republicans who were nominated and elected by the Delegates at the Delegates caucus. Members are elected for a two-year term.

Members attend the Annual State Committee meetings in January to elect the state Chairman and officers of the State Committee, and to vote on any amendments to the State Committee bylaws.

Members of the State Committee also attend monthly meetings of the County Republican Committee to elect officers, vote on bylaws, and conduct the business of the committee.

Not all Delegates are State Committee members!

Not all Members are Delegates!

You can be both, but it's not automatic.
